Gerald Mäsch is Director of the Institute for International Business Law at the University of Münster, Germany, and Co-Director of Münster's Centre for European Private Law (CEP). He has held various Visiting Professorships, was a *Marie Curie Fellow* at the Institute for European and Comparative Law, University of Oxford (Linacre College) and a *Visiting Research Fellow* with the Institute of Global Law, University College London.

He specializes in Private International Law and International Civil Procedure as well as in Competition Law, International Insolvency Law and Comparative Law and has authored numerous publications in these fields. He teaches Private International Law and International Civil Procedure at the University of Münster and the Swiss Open University at Brig (VS).

Prior to his career in academia, Gerald Mäsch worked as attorney in private practice specialized in competition law, IT law, and distribution law. He sits on the supervisory board of a German IT- and telecommunication company. From 2006 to 2013, Gerald Mäsch was a judge with the Appellate Court Hamm, Germany, where he heard appeals mainly in the area of private international law and international transport law.
