MASTER GERMAN LAW

The 3-semester Master degree programme in German Law is conceived for foreign lawyers, who want to get an insight into the German legal system and its context in order to independently expand their knowledge of German Law. The programme provides students with an introduction to German law (including in-depth examination of specific legal areas) and a secure understanding of its functionality and language. The LL.M. degree serves as the basis both for doctoral study in Germanyand practical work on cases related to German law.* All lectures of the programme are exclusively held in German. For the admission to the law programme, an undergraduate law degree and a proficiency of C1 in German are required.

For those, whose level of German is at least B1, the University of Münster offers special intensive language courses in German in order to pass the DSH-2 or DSH-3. These courses usually take about 1 or 2 semesters.

We offer winter (October) as well as summer semester (April) intakes. As the Master in German Law is a programme with non-restricted admission, you will be admitted, if you meet all the admission requirements. Application deadlines are March 15th for summer semesters and September 15th for winter semesters.



SPORTS

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Germany has committed itself to being a land of ideas. To accomplish this task, government has invested significantly in education, keeping university fees low for students.

TOP LEVEL EDUCATION AT A LOW PRICE

You do not have to pay tuition fees at the WWU! However, like all German public universities, we charge a semester fee to support our student service institutions. Your fee includes our semester ticket with which you can use all public busses, trams, the underground and regional trains throughout the federal state of North-Rhine Westphalia free of charge. The semester fee currently is about € 300 per semester.

LIVING EXPENSES

The cost of living for students is approx. € 780 per month in Münster. Even though there are many job offers for students in Münster, you should have sufficient financial means to cover these costs. Because studying is very time-consuming, you won't have much time for a student job.

VISA

If you need a visa to enter Germany, you will have to prove that you have enough money to support yourself. In most cases, applicants have to prove that they have around $\leq 8,700$ at their disposal for the first study year.

YOUR ACCOMMODATION

In Münster, most of the students live in a "WG", a flat usually shared with fellow students. Others prefer furnished or unfurnished apartments in residence halls. The residence halls of the Studierendenwerk Münster (Student Support Services Münster, a non-profit organisation) offer affordable housing opportunities. All in all accommodation is highly demanded and not always easy to find. We strongly advise you to start looking for a place to stay well before you come to Münster. Our International Office will assist you with your search.



SUPPORTING YOU

At the WWU, you will always find advice and guidance throughout your student journey. We have a network of support in place to help you have a smooth start on your study programme at the WWU, and adjust to student life, as well as to make it as easy as possible to find advice on many different issues. INTERNATIONAL OFFICE
